Holocaust Memorial Events

SUNDAY, APRIL 23rd, AT 6:00 P.M. – Holocaust Memorial Service

Israel's Knesset (parliament) established Yom Hashoah, also known as Holocaust Remembrance Day, as a memorial for about six million Jewish people who were slaughtered by the Nazis between 1933 and 1945. The full name of the day is Yom Hashoah Ve-Hagevurah, which means the "Day of (remembrance of) the Holocaust and the Heroism". A short film "Nicholas Winton - The Power of Good", which documents the story of courage and determination of one man who saved 669 from certain death, will follow the service.

SUNDAY, APRIL 30th AT 2:00 P.M. – Holocaust Survivor, Irene Zisblatt will be with us. She is Jodie Snyder's aunt and it coming from south Florida to share her experiences with us and the community. Irene, born in 1929, is a Hungarian-born Holocaust survivor. She was an inmate in Auschwitz-Birkenau and was part of Dr. Joseph Mengele's experiments. She is well known for her autobiography, "The Fifth Diamond". Her experience was also highlighted in Steven Spielberg's 1999 Academy Award winning documentary, "The Last Days". As one of five Hungarian Holocaust survivors, whose story was featured in the documentary, it follows Irene as she and her daughter travel back to sites of memory, including her childhood town and the ghetto she was placed in before she was deported to Auschwitz. The community is invited to attend and there is no charge for this event. A reception will follow where Irene will have her autographed book "The Fifth Diamond" for sale. Please invite your friends in the community to this event. Mrs. Zisblatt will also be speaking to the Temple Emanuel Sunday School children (grades 3 and up) and their parents at 10:30 in the morning

Israel Independence Day – May 2nd, 2017 – 6:30 p.m.

Israel's Independence Day falls on the Hebrew date that the formal establishment of the State of Israel took place when member of the provisional government read and signed a Declaration of Independence in Tel Aviv. The English date that corresponded to was May 14, 1948. JOIN US to celebrate this event at Temple Emanuel on Tuesday, May 2nd, 2017 for an Israeli themed dinner at 6:30 p.m. with a program to follow. Dinner is \$12.00 per adult and \$6.00 for children 12 and under.

Please let the Temple office know you are coming by email or phone by April 28th. Episode 1 of a 6 part documentary will be shown following dinner which follows decades of Zionist activity culminating in the end of the British mandate over Palestine and the United Nations vote recognizing the Land of Israel as the homeland of the Jewish people. The episode ends with the rise to power of Binyamin Netanyahu in 1996.
