Film Titles

July 29th - "G.I. JEWS: Jewish Americans in World War II"

This documentary tells the story of the 550,000 Jewish American men and women who fought in World War II. In their own words, veterans both famous (director Mel Brooks, former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger) and unknown share their war experiences: how they fought for their nation and people, struggled with anti-Semitism within their ranks, and emerged transformed.

August 5th - "SNOW IN AUGUST"

Based on the *New York Times* best selling novel by [Pete Hamill](#) featuring a young boy from an Irish Catholic neighborhood of Brooklyn in 1947. The film follows the unlikely friendship that evolves between 11-year-old Michael and a Czechoslovakian Rabbi that stirs up the wrath of a local Irish gang from Michael's neighborhood. Adding to Michael's burden is the fact that he has witnessed a gang administer a bloody beating to a local Jewish merchant, frightening him into silence. The solution to Michael's problem manifests itself in his growing fascination with the legend of "the Golem," the vengeful statue that was supposed to have protected the Prague Ghetto from persecution centuries before — and also hinges upon the boy's adoration of the movie-serial hero Captain Marvel .
