Rose Rosenkranz, a child survivor of the holocaust and Regional Director of March of the Living will tell her compelling story on Wednesday, May 1st at 7:00 p.m. Berkovitz Hall. Dessert reception to follow the program

In 1946, a young husband and wife could finally return to their homes in Poland after 5 years in Slave Labor Camps in Siberia. They had everything they owned in the world with them: some pillows, a blanket, clothes and a 1 1/2 year old daughter born in that camp- Rose (Raisa) Rosenkranz was that child.

Rose has been an Instructor In Holocaust Studies for the Summer Institute for Public School teachers; Instructor at the Judaica Institute of the CJE of West Palm Beach; on the task force for the development of curriculum on Holocaust and African American Studies in the P.B public schools; curriculum for the Catholic Archdiocese and Protestant Church.
