Ela's Forest

The Polk Museum of Art at Florida Southern College is honoring the memory of Ela Deniz with an exhibit, *Ela's Forest*, through Feb. 23, 2020. Ela was the granddaughter of Temple members Barry Friedman and Sharon Hodges.

The exhibition features works by artists close to Ela and her family. Among them is Michael Barickman, a member of Temple Emanuel. In addition, donations from several Temple Emanuel members helped fund the exhibit.

"*Ela's Forest* is a real forest of trees planted in locations around the world. It bears the name of a little girl who loved nature and whose short, beautiful life was radiant," writes Claire Orologas, executive director emerita and curator of *Ela's Forest*.

"The forest continues to grow as her community plants more trees to honor her memory and keep her light bright.

"As a member of that community, the Polk Museum of Art adds to *Ela's Forest* through this exhibition featuring works by artists close to Ela and her family. It is meant to be an expression of love, support, and comfort to the family as well as a poignant reminder of the importance and power of community."
